Foote's summer season at the Haymarket ran for some fifty-three performances. His company of nineteen actors and actresses and two dancers was largely recruited from performers at the patent theatres, but included five new ones: *Actors* and *Actresses*: Mrs Burden, Miss Cheney, Costollo, Davis, Foote, Gardner, Mrs Granger, Johnson, Keen, Mrs Kennedy, Marshall, Parsons, Mrs Parsons, Pearce, Preston, Miss Reynolds, Shuter, Tindal, and Waller. The *Dancers* were juveniles: Master Clinton, and Miss Street.
